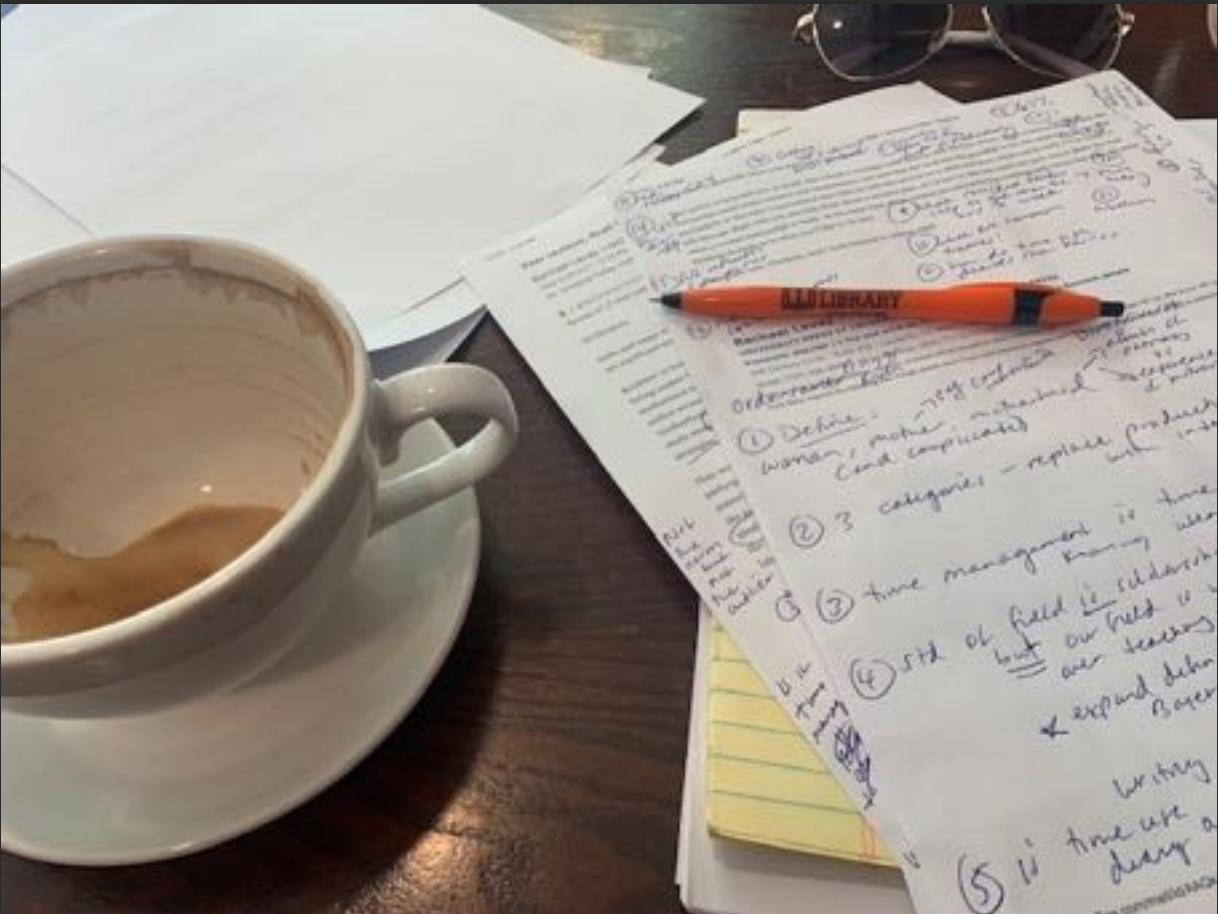


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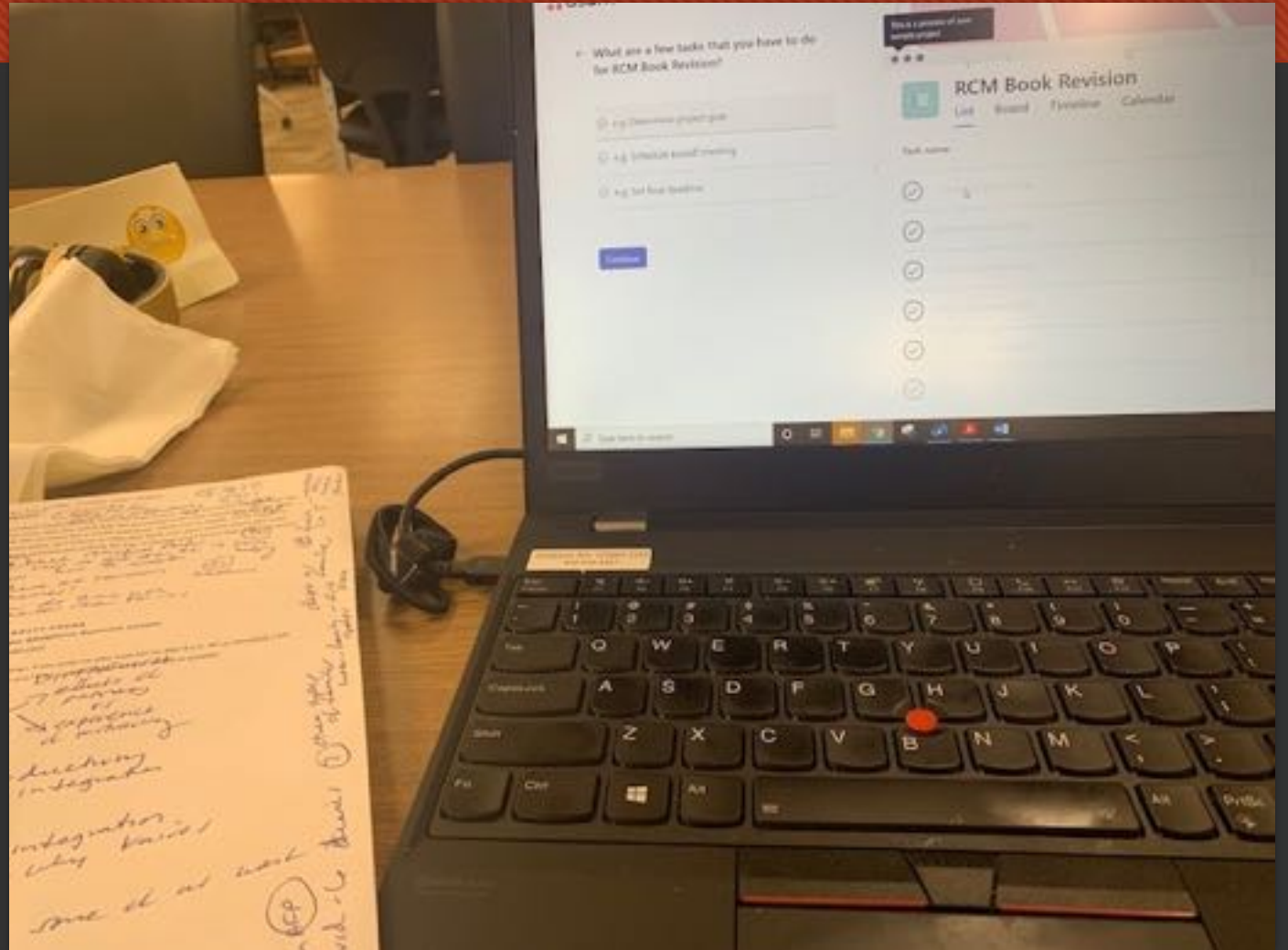

- not all writing captured was for publication in traditional peer reviewed journals (i.e. Hassel's post about her teaching/university situation) - this has a real audience and makes a real difference in faculty lives, why is it less valuable than office hours with our students
- Argue Boyer's varieties of scholarship are represented in diary captures thus the idea of fixed notion of scholarship as gold standard is in play
- as rhet comp scholars we study writing and enjoy how it is made; spending time on writing is engaging with that enjoyment (sometimes)
- I've got an earth shaker, not all of us love teaching - even my reviews are suggesting that teaching should be put first, yes comp is a teaching subject but our engagement isn't always through teaching

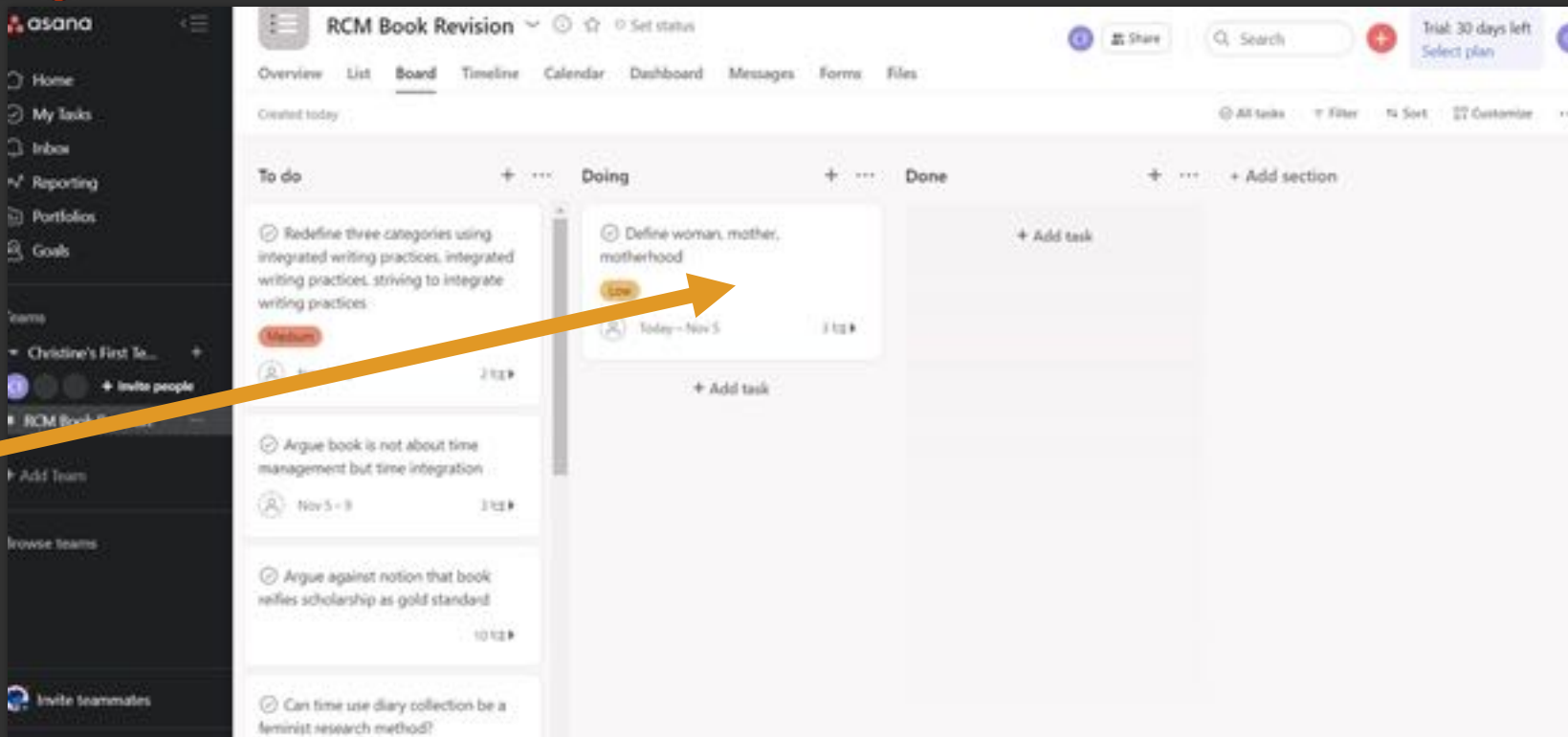


