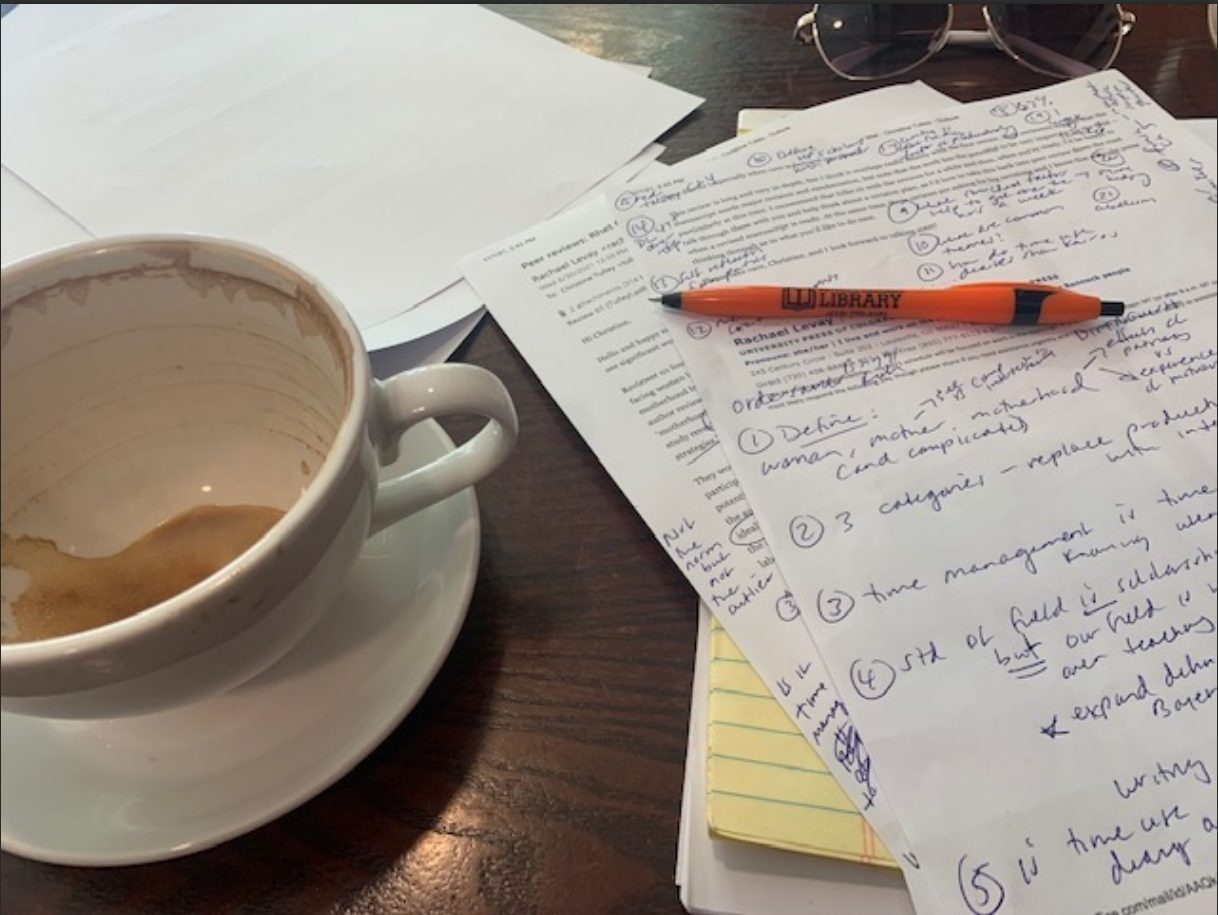


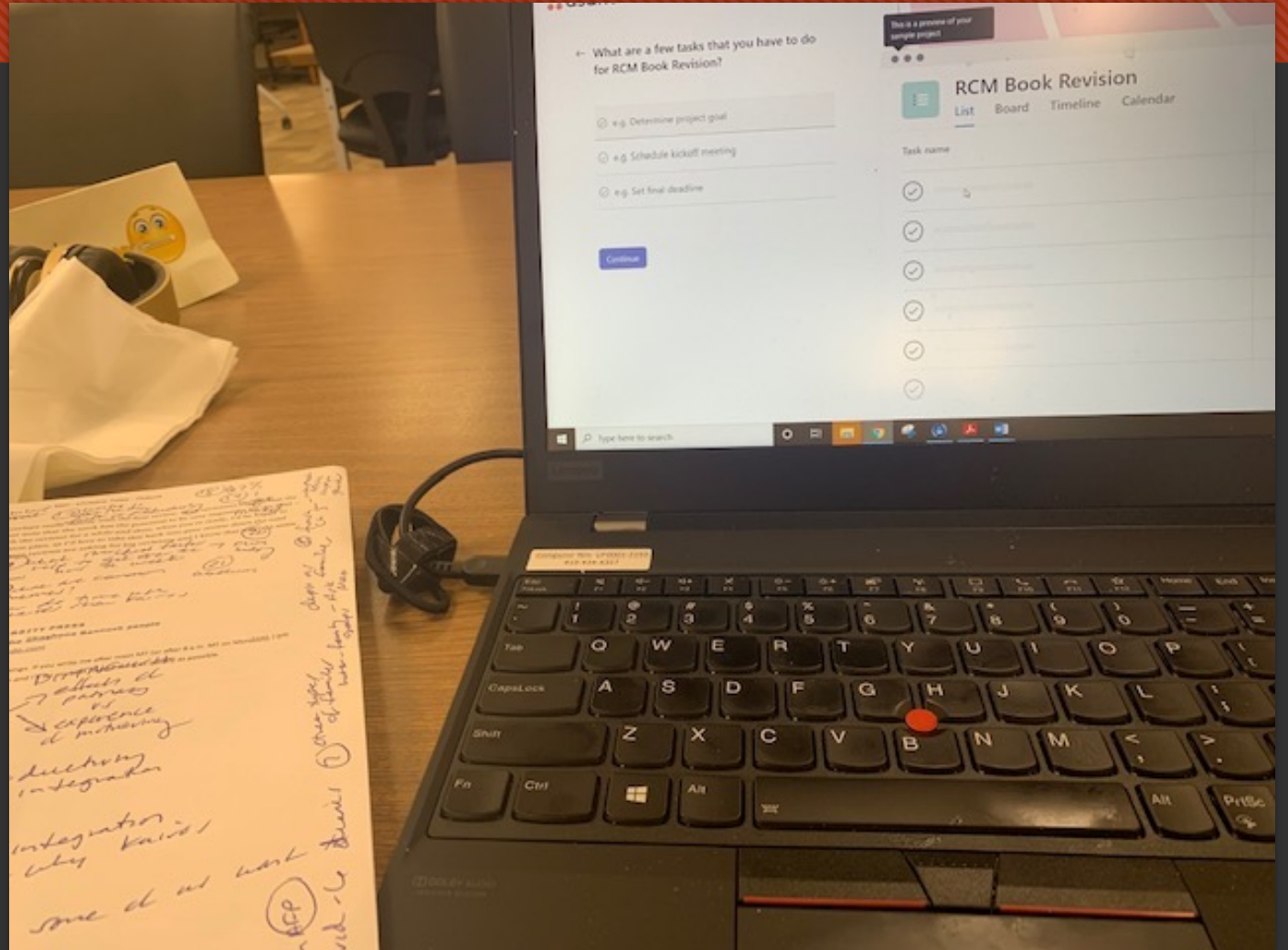

not all writing captured was for publication in traditional peer reviewed journals (i.e. Hassel's post about her teaching/university situation) - this has a real audience and makes a real difference in faculty lives, why is it less valuable than office hours with our students

Argue Boyer's varieties of scholarship are represented in diary captures thus the idea of fixed notion of scholarship as gold standard is in play   




as rhet comp scholars we study writing and enjoy how it is made; spending time on writing is engaging with that enjoyment (sometimes)

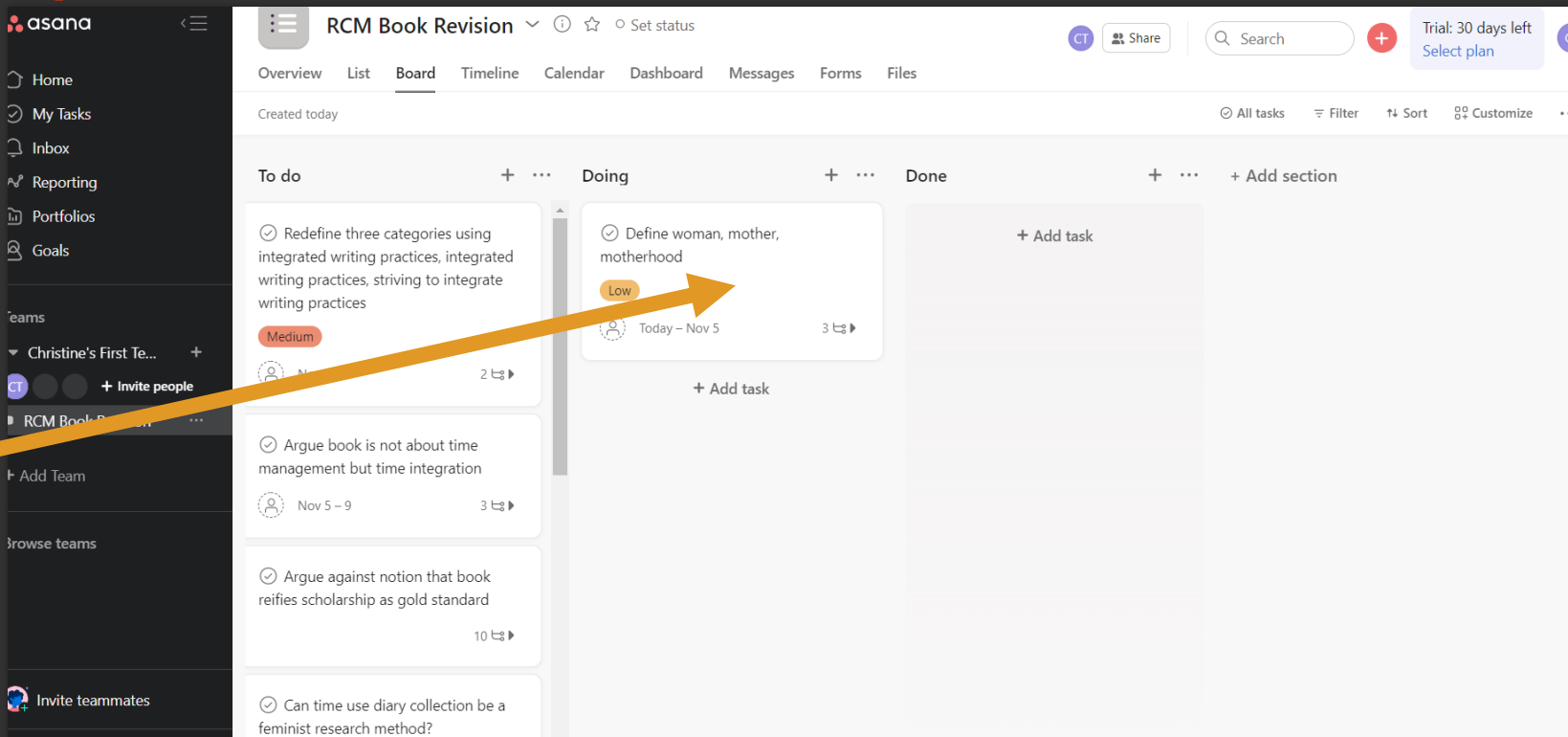


