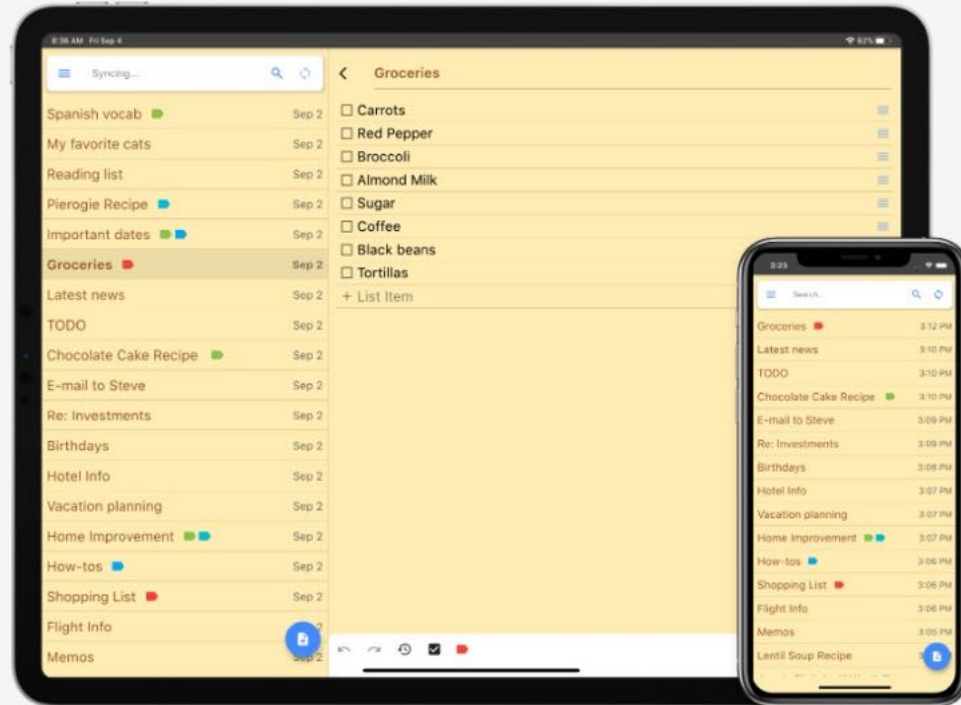


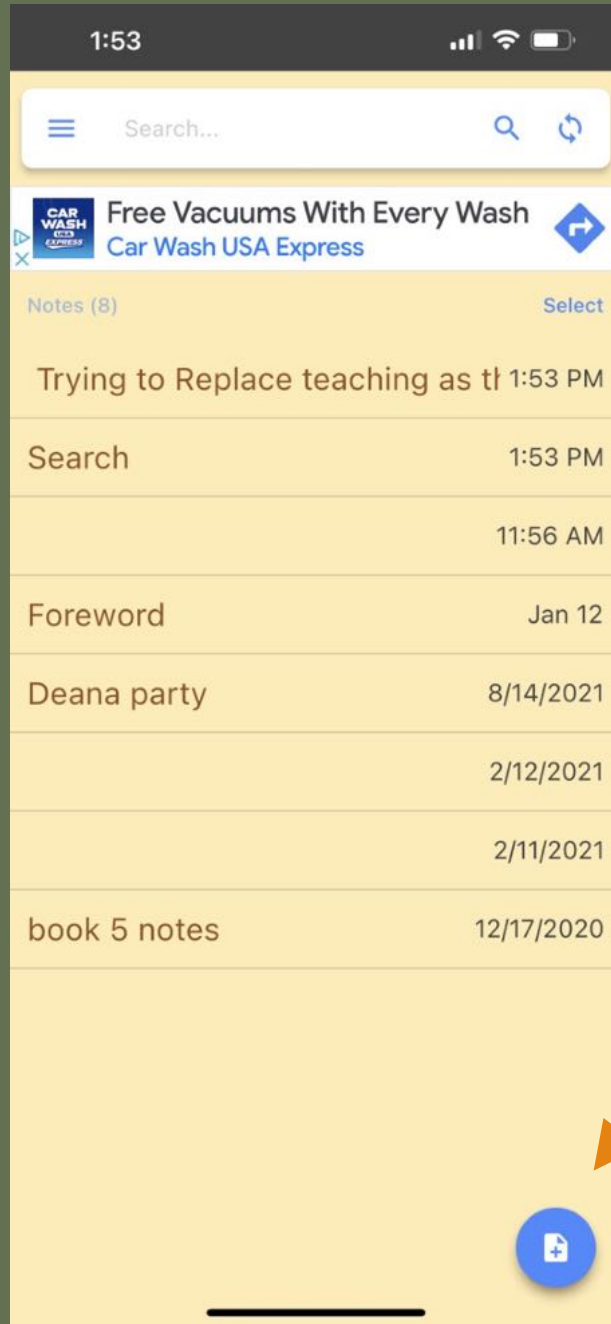

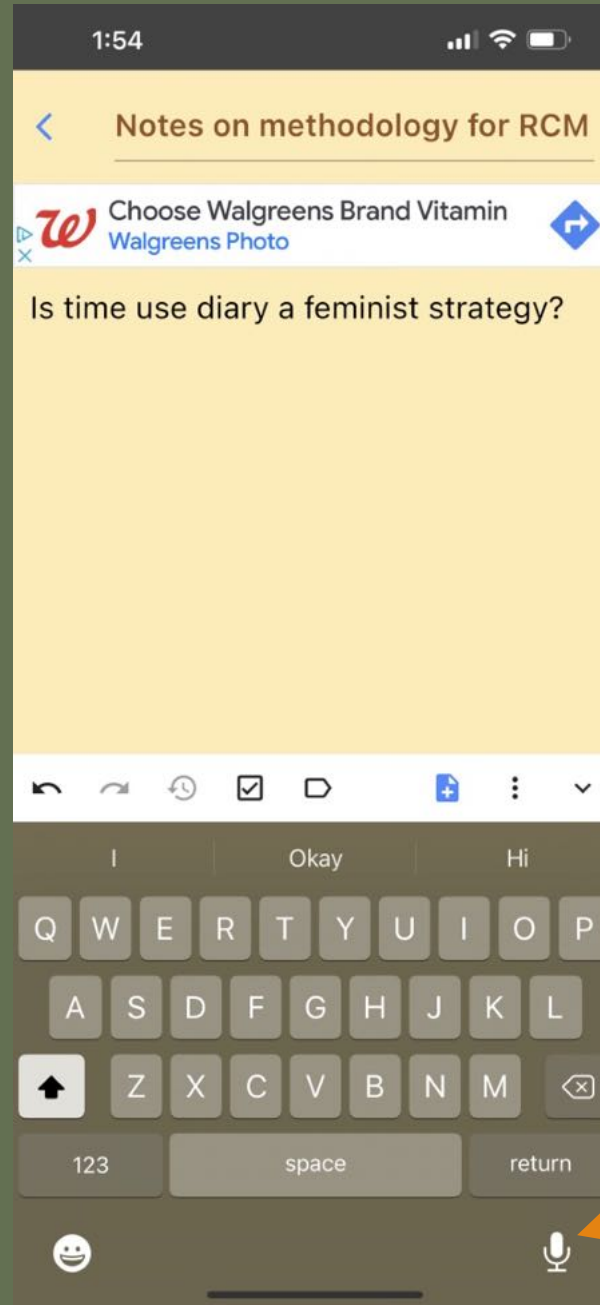

Name note at top and start typing at bottom

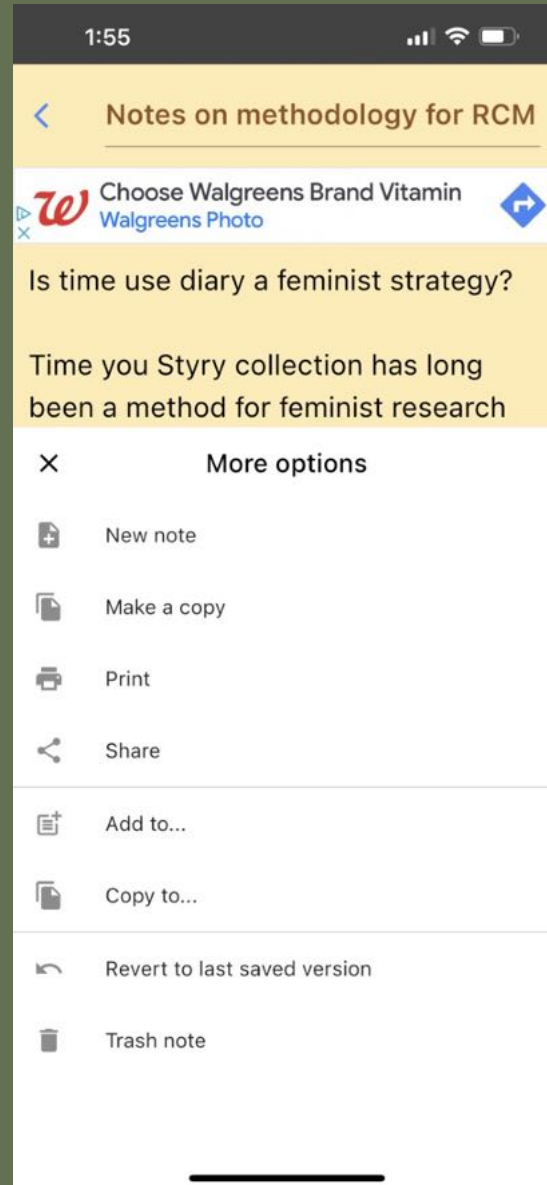


Microphone to audio record notes




Audio dictation shows up as notes
